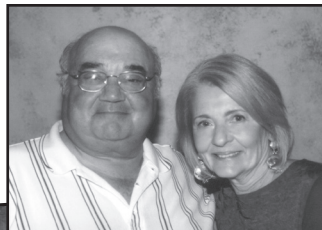
**In Loving Memory of Uncle Rich**

I will be forever indebt to this organization not only for what you and everyone has done for me, but for how and when it was done for me. Although I'll never be able to repay that debt, I hope to have the opportunity to give it my best effort some time soon.

Each of the 2.5 million annual deaths in the United States directly affects four other people, on average. For most of these people, the suffering is finite ~ painful and lasting, of course, but not so disabling that 2 or 20 years later the person can barely get out of bed in the morning. For some people, however ~ an estimated 15% of the bereaved population, or more than a million people a year ~ grieving becomes what Dr. M. Katherine Shear, a professor of psychiatry at Columbia, calls "a loop of suffering." This extreme form of grieving, called complicated grief or prolonged grief disorder, has attracted much attention in recent years.

There is no formal definition of complicated grief, but researchers describe it as an acute form persisting more than six months, at least six months after a death. Its chief symptom is a yearning for the loved one so intense that it strips a person of other desires. Life has no meaning; joy is out of bounds. Other symptoms include intrusive thoughts about death; uncontrollable bouts of sadness, guilt and other negative emotions; and a preoccupation with, or avoidance of, anything associated with the loss. Complicated grief has been linked to higher incidences of drinking, cancer and suicide attempts.

In an age when activities like compulsive shopping are viewed as disorders, the subject of grief is especially sensitive. Deeply bereaved people are often reluctant to talk about their sorrow, and when they do, they are insulted by the use of terms like disorder or addiction. Grief, after all, is noble ~ emblematic of the deep love between parents and children, spouses and even friends. Our sorrows, the poets tell us, make us human; would proper therapy have denied us Tennyson's "In Memoriam?"

Diagnosing a deeper form of grief, however, is not about taking away anyone's sorrow. "We don't get rid of suffering in our treatment," Dr. Shear said. "We just help people come to terms with it more quickly."

## Acquire the Facts! – Part 3

We have been looking at the topic of fear in this series of “The Spiritual Corner.” Like a bear trap, once in the grips of fear, the teeth can dig and rip at our souls until we feel like gnawing off whatever is caught just to escape its hold on us. We have been using the word “fear” itself as an acronym to help us pry loose from its horrible grip. In part one we said that we need to “Face” our fears directly and then in part two we need to “Engage” our fears with prayer. The next step is to “Acquire the Facts.”

One of my favorite stories in the Old Testament is the story about Elijah and Jezebel. In 1 Kings 19, we learn that Queen Jezebel had killed several of God’s prophets and was out to kill Elijah. So, in fear of his life he ran into the wilderness to hide. Yet, Elijah’s fear was centered on a couple of thinking errors. First, Elijah erroneously thought he was going to die. Second, he believed he was the only prophet left to speak for God. Not only was his thinking all wrong, but he had a poor memory too. You see he had forgotten who was really in-charge.

His thinking errors and memory issues caused him to react. Running and hiding were actions totally based on the lies and faulty memory he chose to believe as truth. The untruths and memory inadequacies were left unchallenged by the truth of who God was for his life. It was time for Elijah to acquire the facts.

In verses 11 and 12, God reminded Elijah who was really in-charge by revealing himself in some mighty acts. First, God revealed himself through a mighty wind, so huge that the mountains split. Next, God revealed himself in a violent earthquake and after that a horrible fire. But when God really spoke it was in a small voice. Why did God choose to do that? While there are many possible reasons for God’s awesome display of sheer power, let me offer just one. His display of power reminded Elijah who is really “boss.” It was God, not Queen Jezebel, who was in charge of Elijah’s fate.

In verse 18 God sets the record straight. Elijah is not the only one left, in fact there were 7000 prophets in reserve, ready to be called up at a moment’s notice. FACT, Elijah was not alone. Armed with truth, Elijah left his cave of fear and the wilderness of despair and got back into the game (read the rest of the story to find out what happens next).

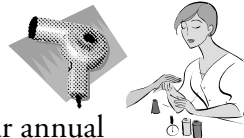
When you and I are caught in the jaws of fear, many times we are bound by the lies we choose to believe. “I’m alone!” or “There’s no solution!” or “I don’t have what it takes to overcome!” or “I am powerless!” or “I don’t have the resources!” or “I’m not skilled!” or “I’m a failure!” or “I can not do it!” or “There’s no way out!” and on and on and on. What it is, is simply believing the “untruths.” We get caught by those lies in part due to faulty thinking and the fact that we fail to remember who is ultimately in charge.

Combating fear requires us to acquire the facts. We may feel alone, but there are people (family, friends, counselors, clergy, neighbors, etc), who are poised to come to our assistance, but may not know we stand in need. We may not have all the skills, but we can partner with those who do or learn a thing or two to empower ourselves to move forward. In short, if we gather the facts, we may find that our fears are pointless and unfounded, just like Elijah did.

Releasing ourselves from the jaws of fears also requires us to remember the fact that God is ultimately in charge. That means He cares for you, that He has your best interest at heart. The Bible says that “all things work together for good to those who love God” (Romans 8:28). While we may not understand, God has a plan for your good. Fact is that God is in charge and he is working in your behalf so why fear.

What fear has a grip on you? Get the facts and remember God is in charge, working for your good. AMEN!
